Understanding Sexuality: Supporting Same-Sex Attracted Women from Immigrant and Refugee Communities



Our culture and our cultural perspective and background is extremely important to us. It actually grounds us; it tells us who we are, where we come from. And that's the same for the other communities. (lesbian from immigrant background)

Same-sex attracted people from ethnic communities have a strong need for culturally-appropriate support and understanding about their sexuality, both from the mainstream GLBTIQ (gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer) community as well as from their own ethnic communities.

Based on extensive consultations with representatives from multicultural GLBTIQ groups, community workers and health professionals, the Multicultural Centre for Women's Health (MCWH) has developed the *Understanding Sexuality* training program for bilingual and bicultural community workers.

This informative and culturally-relevant half-day program aims to:

- ★ increase awareness in community workers of the issues facing their GLBTIQ members, women in particular;
- ★ build community worker capacity to support GLBTIQ members of their communities; and
- ★ enhance the ability of community workers, particularly those working closely with their communities on a range of issues, to break down stereotypes, address fears and offer people alternative discourses for their understanding of sexuality issues.

The training program covers a number of topics such as:

- ★ Diversity within sexuality;
- ★ Health issues of same-sex attracted women;
- ★ Disclosure (coming out);
- ★ Heterosexism and homophobia;
- ★ Supporting same sex-attracted women.
