



HOW TO FIND INFORMATION ABOUT CHILDREN'S COVID-19 VACCINATION (5 TO 11 YEARS)¹

➤ WHO IT IS FOR

THIS RESOURCE IS DEVELOPED MAINLY FOR PARENTS FROM MIGRANT AND REFUGEE BACKGROUNDS AND HAVE CHILDREN WHO ARE AGED BETWEEN 5 AND 11 YEARS. WORKERS AND STAKEHOLDERS, SUCH AS COMMUNITY EDUCATORS, MIGHT ALSO BE ABLE TO BENEFIT FROM THE RESOURCE.

➤ OBJECTIVES

THIS FACTSHEET AIMS TO STREAMLINE THE INFORMATION SEARCH PROCESS FOR MIGRANT PARENTS, WHO WANT TO KNOW MORE ABOUT CHILDREN'S COVID-19 VACCINATION, BY

- CONSOLIDATING INFORMATION FROM TRUSTWORTHY MEDIA PLATFORMS AND SOURCES, SUCH AS GOVERNMENT WEBSITE, MAINSTREAM MEDIA AND CENTRELINK WEBSITE;
- PROVIDING LINKS AND MEANS TO ACCESS THE INFORMATION;
- DEVIDING THE INFORMATION INTO SEVERAL SECTIONS BASED ON VARIOUS INFORMATION NEEDS OF COMMUNITY MEMBERS.

➤ HOW TO USE

MIGRANT PARETNS CAN USE THE INFO PACK TO GET FAMILIAR WITH ALL INFORMATION RELATING TO CHILDREN'S COVID-19 VACCINES OR GO TO A PARTICULAR SECTION OF THE INFO PACK IF YOU ARE LOOKING FOR INFORMATION RELATING TO A SPECIFIC TOPIC².
